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## **Heber SEND Tips**

To all families, we are going to start including weekly tips and links to help support any children with learning difficulties at home. Each week will have a different theme. This week's tip is about:

#### **Emotional Regulation**

With the darker days, transition back to school and the excitement of holidays over, we can all feel a little down at this time of year. It is important to talk and share this with children so that expressing their feelings is normalised. You can encourage different ways to express your feelings, particularly for children who find communication hard. Some different ways of expressing your emotions can include:

- · Drawing a picture of how you feel
- Acting it out
- Pulling faces in a mirror
- · Copy my face/actions
- Charades

Once your child has expressed how they are feeling, you should do the same. You can then talk to them about what they are feeling, that it's okay and what they can do to feel better. # Miss Grace's Music Update

It has been a fantastic first week of music at Heber. Students have thrown themselves into learning their new instruments. KS2 have been introduced to the instruments they will be learning for the next two terms. They will be playing these in the end of year Summer Concert.

<u>Year One</u> have started learning Ta (crotchet) and titi (two quavers). They have been reading and clapping different rhythmic patterns.

<u>Year Two</u> have been learning about dynamics and have explored playing the claves softly as well as loudly and moving between the two. They all played together, following the dynamics shown by a conductor, chosen from the class.

<u>Year Three</u> will be learning the recorder this term. An email has been sent out with a link, as all children will need to bring their own recorders into school. If you have any problems acquiring a recorder please do let us know. In preparation for starting the recorder in two weeks, we began learning how to read the treble clef stave. We created our own mnemonics to remember the lines of the stave - E,G,B,D and F.

<u>Year Four</u> started learning the Djembe drum, they learned about its origin and purpose and what materials it is made out of. They started to learn how to play the bass tone and the open tone.

<u>Year Five</u> began learning the steel pans. They learned about its fascinating history and origins. As an introduction to all the notes on the Jumbie steel pan, they learned to play the G Major scale.

<u>Year Six</u> are continuing to learn the ukulele. They have already learned the C and F major scales. This week they had a go at plucking a melody and learning the new pieces that they are going to perform in their class assemblies.
