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This week in Art and Music...

Year 4 were lucky enough to be selected out of 100 primary schools to be the recipients of a Music and Art workshop held by Conductive Music Group. This fitted perfectly with Year 4's Music in Art topic. They had brilliant fun listening to a professional story teller and making conductive music through graphite pencil leaves and metallic instruments! They also created their own mini stories complete with their own body percussion as sound effects. The children behaved impeccably for the visitors and were captivated by the musical story telling. It even gave us inspiration to create our own musical mobiles, combining not only both music and art, but also to assist in our school becoming more Eco friendly. We hope to make these soon and hang them in the Heber garden.

Elsewhere in Art, one of the Year 3 classes were excited to finally complete their Heber group mosaics as part of their Day in the Life of a Roman topic. More tiles needed for the final ones to be completed!

Year 2's architect designed buildings are beginning to take shape and they are looking forward to decorating them with colourful shapes, stickers and painted collage paper as their doors, windows and chimneys next week!

Year 5 will be going on a local visit to Dulwich Park on 27 March and 3 April as part of their Nature in Art topic, a letter will be sent

out shortly with details.













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This week year 1 started to learn a new song- The Noises in the Night. They thought about which instruments they could add to make different noises, then they played and sang together.

Year 2 did a brilliant job learning the titika rhythm (one quaver and two semi-quavers). They clapped through some complicated rhythmic patterns using titika with confidence.

Year 3 have now learned B, A and G on the recorder. They played Caterpillar Bye-bye, which uses A and B, which they read from the treble clef stave. They moved really nicely between A and B, making sure to blow gently.

Year 4 are continuing with their Djembe drumming. This week they had a fantastic workshop from the Conductive Music team, as part of their art and music module that they are studying with Mrs Coulson. They had a go at making their own leaves to add to a musical tree! The leaves were connected to an app via crocodile clips and made lots of different sounds when they were touched. They used these sounds to bring their stories to life.

Year 5 have learned most of You are my Sunshine on the steel pans. They also started to look at their next piece, Panaman. They are learning to play chords to harmonise with the melody.

Year 6 are learning to play My Bestie, using the C and F major chords. They are making great progress moving between the chords smoothly and have also had a look ahead to G7.
