Year 6 used the iPads this week to make research pages about the environmental artists they are studying.


Year 4 enjoyed becoming immersed in some music and making some creative responses in their sketchbooks for their Music in Art topic.


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Heber SEND Tips

This week's tip is about: Fine Motor Skills





Fine motor skills involve the smaller hand muscles to do movements such as cutting, handwriting, folding, typing, zipping or twisting - the list can go on and on.

Many children (and adults) have seen a decrease in fine motor skills with the increased use of devices such as phones. A lack of dexterity is common and impacts on an individual's ability to do daily activities such as writing, typing, dressing, cutting, the list can go on.

We run various fine motor groups throughout the school to support with this, but there are also ways you can support at home.

- Reduce screen time.
- When using devices, don't limit to just watching, tapping games or typing games still can support fine motor development.
