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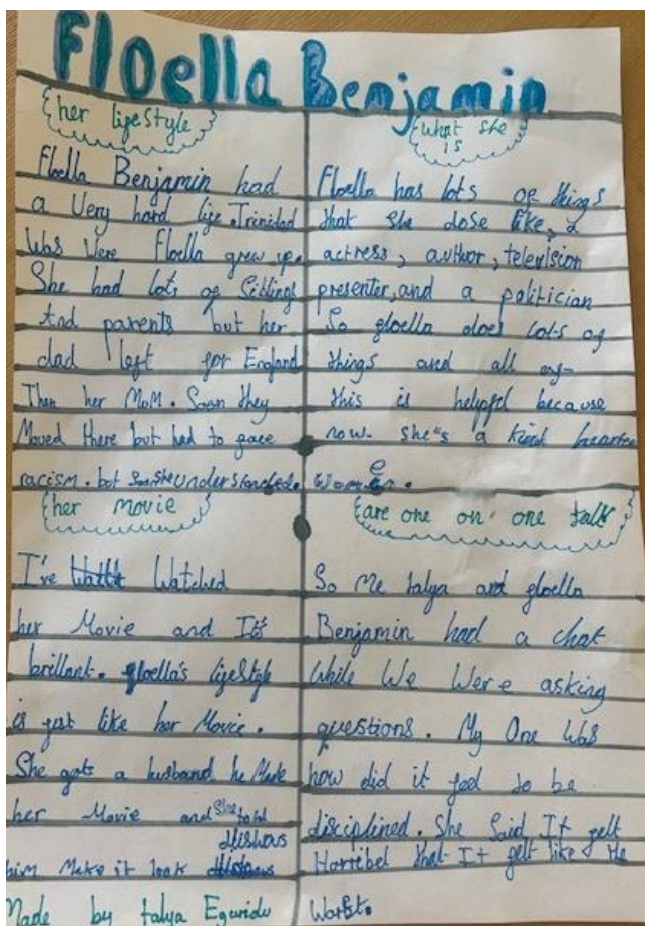
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## Heber meets Floella Benjamin at the BFI!

On Monday, 1V took a trip to the Horniman Museum to visit the Robot Zoo and the aquarium. The Robot Zoo featured larger-than-life animals that have been innovatively recreated using a variety of machine parts and gadgets to reveal how their real life counterparts see, eat, hunt and hide. The children loved controlling the robot animals, especially changing the colour of the giant robot chameleon! They also visited the aquarium to observe the sea creatures. They saw a variety of aquatic life, including clown fish, poison dart frogs and seahorses! 1V had such a great time at the Horniman Museum and enjoyed grouping the animals into the correct animal groups!



## 3R Visit Kew Gardens

On Tuesday, 3R had the pleasure of visiting Kew Gardens as part of our Geography topic: Why do we need to save the Rainforests and how can we do this? 3R journeyed through the tropical rainforest and experienced what a hot and humid climate actually feels like - absolutely sweltering!
