

Thank you for your fantastic letter to me about endangered animals and the environment.
Taking action to improve animal welfare is of great importance to me. You are correct; it is imperative that we work to protect our Bears, Pandas, Orangutans, Elephants and much more. On a personal
level my family and I have adopted a Tiger and an Orangutan through the WWF.
I am proud to support the Government in delivering its pledges to tackle the nature emergency. This
includes planting millions of trees, reducing waste, and ensuring the institutional framework for policy making reflects our commitments to reach net zero, both on land and in the water.
Therefore, I am pleased that the Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Office, as well as the Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs, are presently working on a timeline to
introduce legislation that will mean the UK can ratify the Global Oceans Treaty. The Government has
also committed to a new legal plan to protect and restore our natural environment.
I want to see us achieve the goal of protecting 30% of the UK's land and sea by 2030. Delivering this
target sits at the heart of the mission to ensure nature's recovery, ensuring our most important and wildlife-rich habitats are benefiting from effective, long-term conservation and management.
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Thank you again for writing to me. Please be assured that I will continue to monitor our endangered
animals and the work we are doing to protect them closely.
