Last week, Year 3 was visited by a time traveler who took the children all the way back to the Stone Age! We discovered what life was like in all three periods of the Stone Age. We became nomads, hunter gathers, farmers, and traders. We then went on to create our own 'cave art' on long sheets of paper using charcoal, paints and pastels. After that we completed some Stone Age maths tasks and came up with our own number counting system. Finally, we discovered more about the mystery surrounding Stonehenge and after studying a birds' eye view map of Stonehenge we built our own out of biscuits!

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Music Update

It has been a fantastic few weeks of music at Heber. Students have thrown themselves into learning their new topics. When learning to read rhythmic notation, the whole school have moved to the Kodaly method. This is a more consistent way of learning, that will enable them to move more smoothly into reading complex syncopated rhythms. Year One have been learning about and playing long and short sounding instruments. They have also been successfully recognising high and low pitches. Year Two have been learning how to read Ta (crotchet) and ti-ti (two quavers) and clap them to the beat. They have also been composing short melodies using So and Mi.

All of Key Stage 2 have been continuing with their Kodaly rhythms and Solfa learning. Year Three have been learning about soundscapes. They have been thinking about how we can use music to create an atmosphere or paint a picture. For the first few weeks, they have been focusing on animals and trying to recreate animal sounds, using instruments. Year 4 have been learning about how to write an effective 4 by 4 rhythm using Ta (crotchet) and ti-ti (two quavers). They composed some rhythms as a class and in pairs.

Year 5 have been learning about music technology and software. They have learned how to create a beat on a drum pad, have been using a sampler to create their own sounds and have been using those sounds to make a melody. Year 5 can continue to explore this online using the free websites; Chrome Music Lab and Groove Pizza. If you have an apple device at home, you are also able to access the Garageband app, where they can explore some of the things we have been doing in the lessons, at home. Year Six have been learning about compound rhythm. They have been listening to and feeling the difference between compound time and simple time, by singing, listening and playing rhythm games. They have also started to see how compound and simple time are written, using rhythmic notation.
