## Save the date – Monday 12th May 6pm

The highly recommended 'Two Johns' will be leading an e-Safety parent workshop on <u>Monday 12th May, from 6.00pm to 7.30pm.</u> This parent workshop prioritises strategies that parents and carers of children of all ages can use to promote online safety both in and out with the home environment, covering issues such as:

- How can I protect my child online at home and out of the home?
- What are children currently interested in online and what are the dangers?
- What support is out there to help me to keep my child safe online?
- When should my child be allowed a smartphone and how do I manage it?
- What age restrictions are currently in place and what is best practice as a parent when my child is accessing online gaming?

The Two Johns, formerly police detectives assigned to cybercrime, deliver highly recommended online safety workshops for children, school staff and parents. They have appeared on BBC Breakfast TV, BBC Radio 4, Channel 4 TV and numerous other local radio stations and continue to present in schools across the UK. # **Heber SEND Tips**

This week's tip is about: Sensory Regulation

One of the most common questions asked right now is about sensory regulation. With more difficulties with attention, listening and the prevalence of news items on the rise of ADHD and other diagnoses, everyone is seeking an answer to support their child's learning and avoid the meltdowns or tantrums they experience. Understanding the senses is one key way to support this (Communication strategies is another). We actually have 8 senses that can present differently. Someone could be sensitive to the slightest noise, but enjoy getting as messy as possible when playing. Here is a brief overview:

In the upcoming weeks, we will be hosting a parent workshop on Sensory Regulation and strategies. In the meantime, one of the strategies we use at school to help support regulation is a Sensory Circuit. This is a 10-15 minute max program that follows an alert, organisation and calm routine. Lastly, for any sensory input there are 2 key factors that are vital:

The person helping someone regulate must be calm and regulated themselves- this is called co-regulation

Sensory input is a proactive measure, it is most effective when done before a stressful or possible overloading event. This helps

get someone into a calm state before facing something potentially stressful.
