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Sports Report: Heber vs The World: Dulwich Hamlet Cross Country Showdown

Awaiting us were top opposition schools: Alleyn's, Oakfield Prep, Sydenham High Prep, Rosemead Prep, The Belham, Streatham Wells, Dulwich Hamlet, and Charles Dickens — the cream of South London's runners. And into this athletic cauldron waded Heber Primary, armed with nearly 70 runners across all 8 races from Years 3 to 6. We don't do things by halves.

Our runners were resplendent in their colourful Heber Fun T-shirts, which, while not quite as slick as some schools' tailored running vests, made up for it with charm, energy, and sheer fabric volume. 
