<u>Key Person</u>

Once the children have had a chance to settle into their new environment, we will be completing the key worker groups. Teachers will continue to keep an overview of the whole class, however your child's key worker will play a key part in your child's overall development. Your child's key worker will be shared with you via a letter next week.

Reminders

Please ensure that all items of your children's clothing are labelled. Children are encouraged to put any clothing they take off onto their pegs but things do go astray. It is much easier to return clothes to their owner if they are labelled.

Children should bring their <u>book bag</u> in every day as books and letters and their work will be sent home in them.

Please ensure your child brings their water bottle to school on a Monday. The water bottle will stay in the classes for the week and will go home on a Friday only. Staff will clean and refill bottles on a daily basis. This is to avoid the books getting wet that they borrow from the classes.

Finally, I would like to remind you that you must let the office know if someone else is picking up your child.

Themes

This half-term our theme is 'All About Me'. We will introduce this theme using the story 'The Colour Monster' and 'The Colour Monster Goes to School'. We will be learning about different emotions and using our class 'Mood Meter' to help children express how they are feeling. We will use this half term to get to know the children and their interests. This will then help us to inform what we choose as our teaching themes throughout the year.

<u>Literacy</u>

In Literacy this term, we will be focusing on developing confidence in speaking and attentive listening skills, letter recognition, letter formation and starting our dedicated phonic sessions. We will also be focusing on the development of reading skills through individual reading, sharing of stories and regular practice of Reception key and tricky words. There will be regular opportunities to practice emergent writing and opportunities to use a range of texts including stories and non-fiction books.

<u>Mathematics</u>

In Maths we will be planning a range of activities to promote independent use of number and shape. Our main objectives will include; subitising, relating a numeral to an amount, problem solving, pattern and shape knowledge. Mathematics is embedded into children's everyday situations and their independent play. Through observations and photographs we will record their learning and display this in their learning journeys.

Home Learning

Reading books will be sent home once a week for your child to develop their reading skills. We will change the reading books every **Monday**. To increase your child's confidence they will be encouraged to change their sharing book on a daily basis. Please make sure the reading book is in your child's bag each Monday. Please ensure you support your child with his/her reading and try to hear them read several times a week.

Our weekly Reception newsletter, which is sent out via Parentmail every Friday, will explain what the focus of learning has been that week so that you are able to make links at home.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

We want the children to be settling into the new Reception routines of carpet times, play and learn and also contribute to tidy up times. This helps with responsibility and contributing to the classes.

We will support children in building new friendships and initiating conversations with adults and peers.

Communication and Language

We will encourage the children to: Maintain attention, concentrate and sit quietly during appropriate activities.

Extend their vocabulary, especially by grouping and naming, exploring the meaning and sounds of new words.

Listen and respond to ideas expressed by others in a conversation or discussion.

Literacy

Enjoy an increasing range of books. Hear and say the initial sound in words.

Link sounds to letters, naming and sounding the letters of the alphabet.

To be able to segment the sounds in simple words and blend them together.

Begin to learn and use new vocabulary in the correct context.

Introduction of a weekly Monster Phonics book to take home.

In our Mathematics we will be following 'White Rose' Mathematics planning alongside 'Mastering Number'.
